**MINUTES OF THE MEMBERS' ANNUAL MEETING**  
**HELD AT 1700 HRS ON 31 MAY 2015**

1. The Members' Annual Meeting provided under Rule 38 of the DSOI Rules, was held at the Defence Services Officers' Institute (DSOI) Dhaula Kuan, New Delhi at 1700 hrs on 31 May 2015. The Meeting was convened by the Managing Committee of DSOI and was attended by a large number of members of this premier institute.

3. The President introduced himself and other Committee Members, giving details of the portfolios being handled by them and took the opportunity to welcome all members for the Members' Annual Meeting 2015. On behalf of the Managing Committee, he wished good health, happiness and prosperity to all members and their families.

4. Before his formal address, he informed the gathering that DSOI have lost 184 esteemed members and 07 staff members who have left for their heavenly abode during the past two years. The President, on behalf of all members and the Managing Committee, prayed to God that their souls rest in peace and may God Almighty give their family members strength to bear the loss. He requested all the honourable members present to stand up and observe two minutes silence to pay our collective respect to the departed souls, and the House observed two minutes silence. The President, thereafter, gave his Opening Address and declared the Meeting opened. His address to the members is attached as Appendix.

5. **Maj Harjit Singh (Retd) (M.No 14948)** enquired about the action taken by the Management towards the bereaved families of late members.

**Reply:** The Secretary brought out that condolence letter along with application forms for membership transfer to the widows were invariably sent to the spouses of the late members for grant of Associate membership and action taken as per reply received.

6. **Absence of Dir Coord DSOWF.** Maj Harjit Singh (Retd) (M.No 14948) enquired why Hony Secretary DSOWF is not present in the meeting?

**Reply:** *The Secretary informed the member that a letter was sent to the officer but due to some unavoidable pre-commitment he could not attend the meeting. The President also brought out that he personally spoke to Col JS Kanwar, Dir Coord DSOWF as the requirement was informed to him by some of the honourable members. However, Dy QMG is attending the MAM as VP and Chairman of Housing and AS&D and Rep of EC Chairman.*

7. **Violation of Policy By DSOWF.** Lt Col SK Nagrath (Retd) (M.No 4162) brought out that he rang up AHQ QMG' branch and asked for Dir Coord DSOWF five times and his PA replied that four times message has been conveyed and Dir Coord never came on line, such a state of affairs is unacceptable. He further added that DSOI/DSOWF have arbitrarily amended/changed the rules despite of Hon'ble Delhi High Court writ petition of August 1989 titled Maj Gen SN Puri & ORS whereby, while disposing the writ petition directing to maintain "Status Quo" ante. However, it is observed that DSOI/DSOWF have since then carried out number of amendments/ changes in Rule/Bye-Laws of DSOI despite of Court order not to do so. As per the member the meeting was not in order. The responsibility of DSOWF is only to rule DSOI. DSOI is the baby of DSOWF. There is an inherent problem in the Management of DSOI. The reason is involvement of DSOWF. He also added that there is no Open Forum or MAM held for the last two/ three years and the Management is doing nothing. He further brought out that he had already spoken to Dy QMG that SMS are not enough and added to deliberate on the issues forwarded by them.

**Reply:** *Brig Gajendra Prasad, YSM, VSM, Dy QMG VP and Chairman of Housing and AS&D replied that SMS as well emails are officially sent. Dy QMG informed the member that last 2 years meeting was not held and we are trying to do something please give us a chance to do and also cut short his speech. The President replied now onwards Open Forum will be held quarterly. He also suggested that high powered inter-service committee be constituted to look into the various*

aspects to improve the deteriorating image of service institute . This was supported by few members. The Secretary informed that all points were included in the agenda and would come up for discussion subsequently.

8. The points and reply were flashed on the screen are given below:-

#### **FINANCE SUB COMMITTEE**

9. **Gp Capt BM Karir (Retd) (Mem No.9805)**. He suggested that the financial difficulties in DSOI, can be solved by reviewing Financial working of the combined officers' Mess and eliminating wasteful expenditure. He also suggested that Issuance of an appeal for donations, should the need arise, will be willingly accepted even by senior members and he offered a contribution of Rs 10000/-).

**Reply:** The Secretary informed the member that various steps have already been taken to avoid wasteful expenditure and receiving of contribution is not considered appropriate at this stage.

10. **Wg Cdr J Kumar (Retd) Mem No.13232**. Brought out that the balance sheet up to 31 Mar 2015 should be presented and the balance sheet for 2012-13 now belatedly wrong presented is not acceptable.

**Reply:** Wg Cdr A Gopa Kumar (Retd) also replied to the member that efforts are on to finalise the Balance Sheets for FY 2013-14 and 2014-15 at the earliest. It will not be feasible to include the same in the present MAM on 31 May 15.

11. **Lt Col BS Bakshi (Retd) (M.No 26232)**. Brought out that Accounts for FY 2012-13 & 2013-14 should be put up together after being audited by DSOI's auditors. He asked why the auditor is not present in the meeting. He also added that auditors representative should be invited to attend the meeting and satisfy the members on points raised by them regarding audit report. Even Balance sheet was not signed by the Chartered Accountant.

12. The member also brought out that an empowered committee should be formed drawing the talent from among the members, which should guide the day-to-day functioning of DSOI. This committee should go into reasons why institute is making operational losses to the tune of Rs 3 Cr. They should bring out a blue print for efficient and profitable functioning of the Institute. Revised audit report should be shared with members before the next meeting.

**Reply:** Wg Cdr A Gopa Kumar (Retd) replied that Balance sheet was signed by the CA and he has shown a signed copy to member. Secretary welcomed the contribution of the member..

13. **Cmde Dubash (Retd) (Mem No. 9598)**. Cmde Dubash enquired why DSOI is not having an internal Auditor for day to day auditing.

**Reply:** Wg Cdr A Gopa Kumar (Retd) brought out that one of the DSOI staff is employed as a full time internal auditor.

14. **Lt Col SK Nagrath (Retd) (Mem No. 4162)** brought out that mandatory requirement to mail written notices along with audited Balance Sheet, No Balance Sheet seems to have been sent for the FY 2013-14, 2014-15 which is highly irregular and not acceptable. Hence the SMS Messages are of no consequences alone on this count so the meeting scheduled on 31May 2015 is invalid.

**Reply:** *Wg Cdr A Gopa Kumar (Retd), Asst Secy (Fin) replied that Bal Sheet for the FY 2013-14 and 2014-15 are under preparation and will not be part of MAM being held on 31 May 2015.*

15. **Wg Cdr SC Pathak (Retd) (Mem No. 14263)** brought out that the financial impact of switching over from old billing system to new advance cash deposit system now being followed for last 2 yrs. The new system removes earlier financial burden of 45 days credit involved members monthly bills incl headache of unpaid bills. New system on other hand leaves a huge cash reserve in DSOI kitty, since members leave reserve in their accounts for future usage and avoid every visit charging of respective cards. A cost benefit analysis of new and old system will bring out a happy financial reserve with DSOI whose benefit may be passed to improve the services of members.

**Reply:** *Asst Secretary (Fin) informed the member that even after the implementation of collection of subscription on an annual basis, due to lack of penalty clause, There is a delay in making payment by members who are not using the club facility regularly.*

16. **Brig CM Nayar (Retd) Mem No 2975)** suggested that coupons should be refunded and loaded to Smart Card by the accounts clerk at the reception counter in the manner as cash was loaded in smart card.

**Reply:** *The point was accepted by the President.*

17. **Cmde Dubash (Retd) (Mem No.9598)** requested not to waste the time of members present here. After seeing this audit report .nobody wants to pass this Balance Sheet for the year 2012-13. This meeting should be called off and next mtg to take place after completion of Balance sheet for the year 2012-13 & 2013-14 together. He also said that B2C System is running their system more than 8 yrs at DSOI.

**Reply:** *The President explained the reasons for the delay in finalizing the balance sheet for the year 2012-13. . Asst Secretary (Fin) informed that the balance sheet for both the years will be ready by 30 September 15.*

18. **Gp Capt BM Karir (Retd) (Mem No.9805)** brought out that it is a tradition in the services to honour sr members (above 75 yrs) in the offrs' messes by not charging them entrance fee/subscription. It was even in DSOI till 2008. This point was also brought out by Lt Col BS Yadav (Retd) (Mem No.15567) .

**Reply:** *The President explained that the financial position of the DSOI for the last 3 years was in red. The Asst Secretary replied that this point was taken up during MCM and decision was taken to maintain status quo. However after detailed discussion it was unanimously decided that all 860 members exempted from paying subscription will also start paying and there will not be exemption to elderly members hence forth.*

19. **Lt Col SK Nagrath (Retd) (Mem No. 4162)** requested that If the Management cannot take the age limit for 75 years for non- payment of subscription please take it from 80 yrs as done in Gymkhana Club.

**Reply:** *Not agreed to by the MAM.*

20. **Subscription of Lady Members (Widows) to 50%** Mrs Rukhman Jain (Mem No.444 ) requested to reduce the subscription of Associate lady Members (Widows) to 50%. Lt Col RK Dahiya (Retd) (Mem No.13695 ) also supported this. This point was already brought by Maj Harjit Singh (Retd) (Mem No. 14948) also.

**Reply:** *The proposal was agreed from the next FY onwards.*

21. **Lt Col BS Bakshi (M.No 26232)** brought out that status quo should be maintained as regards revision of membership subscription and other proposals till the next meeting.

**Reply:** *It was decided that the changes will be effective w.e.f. 01 Apr 2016.*

22. **Brig K Yadav (Retd) Mem No 22609** was of the opinion that subscription should be increased after 80 yrs as the pension also increased. This was welcomed by some of members

**Reply:** *Not agreed to. The 860 members who are exempted will also pay so as to bring them at par with other elderly members.*

23. **Lady Elected Member.** Lt Col Ravinder Kumar (Retd) (M.No. 25643) brought out that there should be one Lady member included in the Committee and they should also be given right to vote. One reserved seat for lady every alternate year and as a normal candidate they can fight both the seats every year.

**Reply:** *Point agreed to by MAM.*

24. **Dress Code** . Maj Gen JC Sachdeva (Retd) (Mem No. 8042) along with some other members brought out that Dress Code laid down in the regulations stipulates that the officers dependents and their guests are not allowed to enter the premises unless the T-shirt/Shirt/bush Shirts are tucked in.

**Reply of DSOI:** *The Secretary replied that in order to maintain decorum of Institute, it was decided by the Management that the 'T' Shirt, Shirts and Bush Shirts will be tucked in.*

25. Lt Col BS Bakshi (M.No 26232) emphasized that existing Dress Code should continue to be followed. It is the Dress Code of DSOI which sets it apart from other civilian clubs and gives it an exclusive status. Some of the members also requested to continue with the present Dress Code.

**Reply:** *It was decided by the MAM to follow the Dress Code.*

26. **Wearing of Sandals with Strap** . Capt Sathish Kumar (Retd) M.No 2840 requested that due to medical/old age problem some members can't wear shoes. So they may be permitted to wear flatters / Sandals.

**Reply:** *The President assured that on production of medical certificate members having genuine medical problem will be permitted entry to DSOI.*

27. **Wg Cdr J Kumar (Retd) (Mem No. 13232)**. Enquired that Why Gen Body Mtg was not held for the last 2 yrs which is against the law and the members prolonged their tenure against the Bye-Laws?

**Reply:** *The President replied that the delay was basically due to non-finalisation of Bal Sheet for the FY 2012-13, the delay occurred due to change over of previous system to M/s B2C System and software problem associated with the introduction of such system.*

28. **Waive off Subscription**. Mrs Saroj Bhakhri (Mem No. 361) requested exemption of membership fee for member over the age of 80 years.

**Reply:** *The President replied that already in the MAM mtg decision was taken to waive off 50% subscription for widowed Lady Members from the next financial year.*

29. **Opening of Institute on Tuesdays**. Cdr Vishal Bhargava (Mem No. 31082). asked the feasibility of having the Club open on Tuesdays. Most of the clubs do not have closed days as this also leads to a "Loss" in sales. Lt Col BS Bakshi (M.No 26232) stated that leave policy for the employees is a matter of statute under labour laws. Any change or dilution in the leave policy will have industrial relations and employees cost ramifications. This needs a thorough study and any haphazard decision may result in employee unrest and other unforeseen problems. Institute should continue to observe Tuesday as holiday in addition to other closed holidays as being currently done.

**Reply:** *The Secretary explained the member that it is not possible due to the cost incurred on account of ED Pay. He also said that the status quo will be maintained.*

30. **Ratio of Elected Members vis-à-vis Nominated Members**. Lt Col RS Balhara (Retd) (Mem No. 25253) asked why can't be 6 elected members and 6 nominated members in the Managing Committee as below:-

Army - Three

Navy - Two

Air force - One

**Reply:** *Point will be taken up to the EC.*

31. Lt Col BS Bakshi (Retd) (Mem. 26232) asked the Committee that without going into legality let the Serving Officers also get elected. Since a large majority of members are retired service officers, and retired officers are the one who constitute even larger percentage of members using the Institute facilities, they should have bigger say in running the day-to-day affairs of the Institute. It was also supported by some members that there should be equal number of nominated and elected members in the Management Committee. Each Sub Committee should have at least one Elected member. Lt Col RS Balhara (Retd) (Mem No. 25253 and Wg Cdr J Kumar (Retd) (Mem No.13232) also supported this.

**Reply:** *Point will be taken up and till then the status quo to be maintained.*

32. **Lt Col KN Dua (Retd) (Mem No. 8287)** pointed out following:–

(i) **Poor House Keeping.**

**Reply** *Point is noted for improvement*

(ii) **Dress code for Waiters/Barman/Supervisors incl tie and Cap.**

**Reply:** *The Secretary brought out that it is already implemented.*

33. **Closing of Institute.** Brig Dalip Sachdev (Retd) (Mem No. 9918) brought out that the Club over the last more than 30 years had adopted Institute closure on 26 Jan and 15 Aug, on other Gazetted holidays club functioned with limited services, however, off late it has been observed that the club is being closed on number of occasions, this policy requires to be relooked. Maj Harjeet Singh (Retd) (Mem No.14948) also questioned that is DSOI a Government of India's Office?

**Reply:** *The Secretary brought out that this was done keeping in mind the financial burden on the Institute towards Extra Duty Pay being paid to staff for working on holidays (Double rates).. This point is already discussed.*

34. **Charges for Outstation Members.** Brig Inder Mohan Singh (Retd) (Mem No. 20893) enquired that Outstation members are charged Rs 300 even if they have used the DSOI facilities twice in a month on two separate occasions whereas if they continuously use the facility for seven days there is no addl charge. This is absurd. We need to know this anomaly.

**Reply of DSOI:** *The Asst Secy (Fin) replied that the facility of not charging extra for continuous use for 7 days is with an intention that the member is available in Delhi on a leave or vacation. On the other hand if the facilities are availed spread over a period of more than two weeks, it only shows that the members is ordinarily staying within NCR and avoid paying the Active Membership.*

35. **Concession to Senior Veterans above 75 Years of Age.** Lt Col BS Yadav (Retd) (Mem No.15567) stated that it is prevalent all over the world and in all spheres in the country in all institutions denial in DSOI is negation of a right. He also brought out interaction of nominated/elected members with members. They must spend some time and do some duty/discussion with the members to know their troubles/suggestions. Hardly anybody is seen. The President explained that considering the fact that more than 862 elderly members are already exempted from paying subscription as on 2008, and the increase in proportionate membership of retd officers the proposal was not agreed by the Managing Committee.

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied this point was already answered.*

36. **Membership to Dependent Divorced Daughter.** Maj Harjit Singh (Retd) Mem No. 14948 brought out that divorced daughters are dependents of the Ex-Servicemen and granted all the benefits like Family Pension, ECHS entitlement and CSD Facilities etc. So DSOI should also consider divorced daughters as dependents.

**Reply:** *Point agreed to by MAM.*

#### **HOUSING AND GS SUB COMMITTEE**

37. **Wg Cdr SC Pathak (Retd)** (Mem No. 14263) asked why the difference in quality of fittings in Gents Toilet next to Blue Room and the one located near meeting room? Why all toilets are not of the same standard? It is always found that civ staff using services of these toilets, even in the presence of members.

**Reply:** *The President replied that renovation of toilets are planned on priority and civilian staff will not use member's toilet.*

38. **Facelift to Office Area.** Cdr Vishal Bhargava (Retd) (Mem No. 31082) brought out that the office area may be given a facelift, including the Staff toilet.

**Reply:** *The President replied that the point is noted*

#### **ENTERTAINMENT & SPORTS SUB-COMMITTEE**

39. **Weekly Movies.** Wg Cdr Shekhar Chopra, (Mem. No 33471) brought out that number of times this point was discussed but no action has been taken yet.

**Reply:** *The President replied that it will be discussed in the forthcoming MCM for its consideration.*

40. **CCTV Coverage.** Wg Cdr Shekhar Chopra, M.No 33471 informed that on major events more checking and single door entry with CCTV coverage to avoid gate crash. Unauthorised entry by big kids and notorious activities should be prevented.

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied that only two entries are permitted to avoid long queues.*

41. **Construction of Tennis Courts.** Wg Cdr J Kumar (Retd) Mem No. 13232. enquired about the maintenance of Tennis Courts are cold shouldered and Tennis courts are being deliberately and unilaterally disrupted. He said that there is total neglect of maintenance of Tennis Courts through which there is a vehicular traffic and a thoroughfare. Staff quarter gate should be opened. There is no progress in the greening and regrassing of the Tennis courts. He further brought out that let us know the Sports Devp Fund collected since inception and the present status as on 31 Mar 15. He also asked the amounts of funds spent on maintenance of Tennis Courts for the last 05 yrs.

**Reply:** *Asst Secy (Fin) brought out that Balance in Sports fund is Rs 1.84 Crores. The President brought out that construction of two Synthetic Tennis Courts of International level will be constructed soon. He also brought out that opening of staff quarter area gate was discussed during the visit of GOC Delhi Area. Access to Defence area by civilian are denied by him. The road from staff quarter area is also coming up shortly. BOO is already completed for two Synthetic Court and three Grass Court will remain functional. Some of the members have objected to spending huge money for few players.*

42. **Brig PK Upmanyu (Mem No 13913)** The member brought out that this point is irrelevant and Sports should be given first priority and never be undermined. The President also agreed with him.

43. **Lt Col BS Bakshi (M.No 26232).** Efforts should be made to reduce the operational costs of cost centers, which are sport facilities and swimming pool etc. While the Institute should always try to provide best sports and games facilities, the cost incurred should be consistent with the usage of these facilities. Members felt that upgrading of Lawn Tennis facilities should be done in stages as number of members using this facility are decreasing.

**Reply:** *This was agreed by the house*

44. **Sports Development Fund.** Mrs Rukman Jain (Mem. No 444) brought out that \_after charging Rs 240/- as Sports Development Charges, member again charged separate sports fee for using each and every sports outlets. Sport fund be collected from those members who are utilizing any particular facility.

**Reply:** *The President replied that Rs 240/ per year is a mandatory requirement.*

45. **Arrangements for Major Functions.** Brig Dalip Sachdev (Retd) (Mem No. 9918) brought out that efforts of Mgt in organizing major functions like New Year Eve is well appreciated. However due to the VVIP/VIP culture which has been adopted puts majority of members in discomfort. This VVIP/VIP culture has to be stopped as all members have similar status and we cannot have discrimination, however, in case it is still to be adopted then mgt should ensure following :-

(i) **Separate Liquor Counter for members** as majority of bars are crowded by Dependents and it is difficult for member to buy a drink.

(ii) Sufficient arrangement for conveniences to be made for members. During the last yr function it was really sad to see members were using bathing area/changing rooms of swimming pool as urinals, ladies had horrible time as there was no arrangement.

(iii) **Restriction on Complimentary Passes.** It has been noticed that Complimentary Passes are issued to number of Offrs which is against the laid down norms, as per protocol all officers should pay for attending the func and not enjoy these freebies. It has also been observed that passes issued are being misused as they being used by the wards/friends of Officers. Issue of these Passes should be stopped or restricted to bare minimum.

**Reply:** *The Secretary informed the member that the points brought out by the member will be noted for future compliance.*

46. **Swimming Pool Timings.** Cdr Vishal Bhargava (Retd) (Mem No. 31082) brought out following points:-

(i) The pool is open till 2000 hrs, recommended that the shutter leading to the TV Room be kept open to facilitate members to enter the club after swimming. Alternatively, an entry is permitted from the Sky Lounge in the evenings till swimming season. This may also reduce the car parking load in the evening.

(ii) The old lockers in the Swimming Pool changing Rooms need to be repaired / replaced.

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied that we are planning to do so. Entry from the swimming pool will not be feasible as dress code checking and unauthorized entry checking cannot be done.*

47. **Sponsoring teams for various Games.** Lt Col BS Yadav (Retd), (Mem No.,15567) brought out that sponsoring of various activities like Bridge, Tennis, Badminton etc by the institute, gets name and fame. We expect a little contribution on teams and an encouragement to them.

**Reply:** *The Secretary informed the member that the point is relevant and noted.*

48. **Opening of Swimming Pool till 1030 PM.** Cmde KN Dubash (Mem .No 9598) requested to open the Swimming pool till 2230 hrs. Brig PK Upmanyu brought out that swimming pools of 5 stars are opened till 2230 h.

**Reply:** *Coord (F&B) explained that this is as per the orders of Sports Authority of India to close the Swimming Pool at 2000 hrs. It was agreed to open the Swimming pool till 2030 h.*

49. **Pending Points of last MAM.** Brig CM Nayar (Mem.No 2975 brought out those points taken up during the last meeting be discussed.

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied that most of the points were already covered / actioned.*

## CATERING & BAR SUB-COMMITTEE

50. **Bar profit in the Offrs' Mess Gp Capt BM Karir (Retd) (Mem No.9805)** brought out that Bar profit in the Offrs Mess should not exceed 10%. The simplest definition of discipline is obedience of agreements, which we are flaunting by charging profit as high as 35% .

**Reply:** *Member was explained by the Asst Secy (Fin) about the requirement of charging 30% profit. Further, the Institute is running with all civilian staff paid out of DSOI and not like any other Officers' Mess wherein staff is within the Stn/Unit resources. In spite of taking 30% profit the DSOI Bars are at loss of 5 lakhs per month (Approx).*

51.. **Display of Rate list. Wg Cdr Shekhar Chopra, (M.No 33471)** Bar rate list to be displayed on Bar counters during social evenings for transparency.

**Reply:** *This will be kept in mind while organizing future functions.*

52. **Shortage of Tables and Waiters .Wg Cdr Shekhar Chopra, (M.No 33471)** brought out that during Diwali function tables were far in less quantity and no one was there for cleaning and picking up empty plates, Casual labour can be hired to maintain the hygiene in the area.

**Reply:** *Secretary replied that the same is noted for future compliance*

53. **Lack of Variety in Snacks. Lt Col KN Dua (Mem No. 8287)** suggested that there is an urgent need to improve following points regarding Catering:-

- (i) Catering/ lacks variety in snacks / Veg / Non-Veg.
- (ii) Presentation and garnishing of snacks.
- (iii) Desert Variety
- (iv) Cocktails.

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied that we are going to hire 4-6 specialised cooks for Catering Section very soon.*

54. **Improvement in Catering Services. Brig Dalip Sachdev (Retd)(Mem No. 9918)** brought out that the Club has a set menu which has been into existence for more than 30 yrs, no efforts have been made to improve / change the same. We could consider hiring a professional to manage the catering service whereby we could have new dishes to the menu, both for snacks and main course.

**Reply:** *The President assured that we are trying our best to improve all the facilities and also going to hire professional cooks and daily menu is likely to change and we will add more dishes in the daily menu.*

55. **Bakery Outlet. Brig Dalip Sachdev (Retd)(Mem No. 9918)** He apprised the idea of having bakery products is well appreciated. However, we should consider having a reputed bakers / confectioner so as to ensure better quality. The poor quality of products being offered by present contractor has been reported by number of members. We should also provide proper facility, as the present setup gives an impression of a tuck shop. This was supported by number of members.

**Reply:** *The President replied that we are in touch with reputed brands like Haldiram, Bikenerwala, and Evergreen to set up a franchisee in DSOI.*

56. **Uniform with Name Plate for waiters. Wg Cdr SC Pathak (Retd) (Mem No. 14263)** said that he didn't find name of designated Waiter marked on the Card. Had to wait and ask other staff to send the right person to serve. Name of designated stewards for a particular Dining hall was not displayed. Waiters normally remain near the billing counter and move to their office (outside coffee shop).

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied that designated waiters are detailed for all tables, but it is not feasible to put name on the cards. However, point is noted.*

57. **Members feedback. Wg Cdr SC Pathak (Retd) (Mem No.14263)** also brought out that introducing members feedback for each table may be done. It will serve as ground level feedback for Mgmt and shall help compliment staff who excel and perform their duties with sincerity and dedication. The format / Col of the form can be in line with that followed by reputed restaurants / Hotels etc. All Service area and outlet should have feedback system. The action taken by Mgmt to member's feedback can be conveyed through SMS / Email or displayed on notice board / rxn desk. It shall lift the standard of governance and enhance efficiency of the system.

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied that the point is noted for consideration. Moreover, Suggestion books are available in each outlet and suggestions as given by members are strictly implemented. Members are welcome to give their feedback.*

58. **Costing of Menu. . Wg Cdr SC Pathak (Retd) (Mem No. 14263)** brought out that the criterion adopted to fix price of each menu item vis-a-vis prevailing price index / inflation and advantage of having few months credit on yearly fixed prices of the dry / fresh rations supplied by approved contractors. This info should be displayed on notice bd. Since catering is on no profit and loss basis, the pricing of menu should be transparent. If one compares the increase in price of some items over a period of time, these are very high.

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied that our rates are lowest compared to similar Institute, the rates of catering has not increased since last 3 yrs. If we take the cost of cooks alone we are in red.*

59. **Cdr PS Dhupia (Retd) Mem No.20955)** brought out that the food in DSOI is very good and rates are nominal. Even one plate Veg platter is sufficient for a member, himself and his wife.

60. **Snack Counter Cdr Vishal Bhargava.(Mem No. 31082)** brought out following points:-

(i) Snack Counter may be opened near Swimming pool.

**Reply:** *The Secretary told that it is already implemented*

(iii) Opening of the Oasis Bar on Sat/Sun when the Anchor Bar gets full.

**Reply:** *The Secretary replied that both Bars are opened .on Saturday and Sunday*

### **POINTS OF GENERAL NATURE**

61. **Using of LED Bulb. Wg Cdr Shekhar Chopra, Mem No 33471** emphasized the need of using LED bulbs and tube so as to save on electricity bills.

**Reply:** *President replied that this a good point noted for implementation.*

62. **Wg Cdr Shekhar Chopra (Mem No.33471)** The membership login instrs not displayed on web page. Same needs to be added for ease of registering for new members or forgot password option.

**Reply:** *This will be actioned through M/S B2C System.*

63. **Lt Col KN Dua (Mem No.8287)** Affiliation with DSOI Palam Vihar DSOI.

**Reply:** *Actioned*

64. **Cdr Dinesh Khurana (Retd) (Mem No. 11737)** Consider making the entire DSOI area WiFi for the benefit and comfort of the members. Alternatively we may start with the Reading Room, Children's Reading Room, Coffee Shop and see the response before extending to the entire DSOI. The select areas may require 10-12 access points. User ID could be the membership number and the password as chosen individually by the members for security reasons. To further strengthen the security we may install 'Firewall' and this may further give the 'Log Report' of all the users. Controller may be used for the continued connection. Approx cost for aforesaid will be Rs.6.5 Lac. The proposed facility will be useful for all members and will be transparent. If one compares the increase in price of some items over a period of time, these are very high. The benchmark is food pricing levels in our service run messes in NCR. Your intervention on these aspects may be looked into.

**Reply:** *Proposal will be taken up through IT Advisor to Mgmt Committee.*

4. Last MAM was held on 13 Jan 13. There was an inordinate delay in conduct of MAM. This was basically due to non finalization of the Balance Sheet for the financial year 2012-13. ### **FINANCIAL HEALTH**

12. The General fund of the DSOI has gone down to Rs1.66 Cr during the year 2012-13. This is basically because of the provision made towards the WRC arrears to the tune of Rs 3.04 Cr. The excess of expenditure over the income for the year 2012-13 was Rs 2.37 Cr. Total financial effect on salary and other perks to the employees of DSOI in the year 2012-13 was Rs 12.11 Cr .This is almost 86 % of the total

expenditure of DSOI. As on today, the annual manpower cost is Rs. 15.99 Cr. Fixed Deposit for 2012-13 was Rs 22.76 Cr and in 2014-15 it is Rs 21.49 Cr.

13. **Dress Code.** I wish to emphasis that keeping up the traditions of DSOI and towards maintenance of decorum of such a prestigious institute the members may please ensure that the dress code be strictly adhered.

14. I now conclude my address with an assurance to you all that the Management is committed to bring this tri-services premier institute to its original glory and fame and name. It will always be our endeavour to give due importance to the practical aspirations of our esteemed members and to make this DSOI the most preferred choice for all Armed Forces Officers and families, staying not only in Delhi & NCR but the whole country. For that I again seek and request for willing cooperation and positive suggestions from all members.
